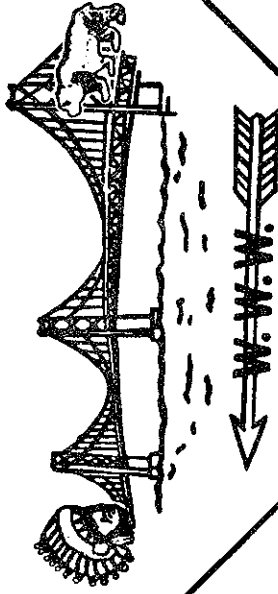

GREETINGS! I AM AN ARROWMAN HERE TO TELL YOU ABOUT SCOUTING'S NATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF HONOR CAMPERS — THE ORDER OF THE ARROW!

THE PURPOSE OF THE OA IS TO RECOGNIZE THOSE SCOUT CAMPERS WHO BEST EXEMPLIFY THE SCOUT OATH AND LAW IN THEIR DAILY LIVES!

TO DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN CAMPING TRADITION AND SPIRIT!

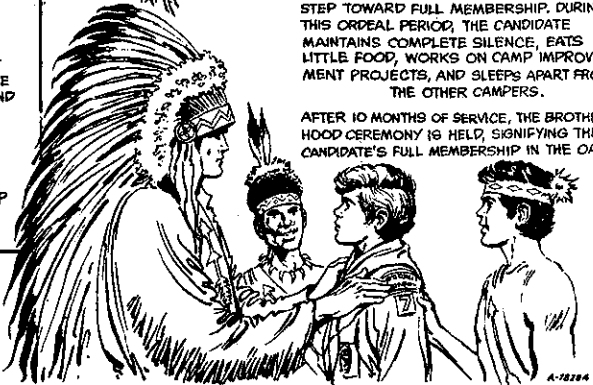
TO PROMOTE SCOUT CAMPING!

TO CONTINUE THE SCOUT HABIT OF HELPFULNESS, LEADERSHIP AND CHEERFUL SERVICE TO OTHERS!



AFTER A SCOUT IS ELECTED, A CEREMONY CALLED THE ORDEAL IS HELD, THE FIRST STEP TOWARD FULL MEMBERSHIP. DURING THIS ORDEAL PERIOD, THE CANDIDATE MAINTAINS COMPLETE SILENCE, EATS LITTLE FOOD, WORKS ON CAMP IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS, AND SLEEPS APART FROM THE OTHER CAMPERS.

AFTER 10 MONTHS OF SERVICE, THE BROTHERHOOD CEREMONY IS HELD, SIGNIFYING THE CANDIDATE'S FULL MEMBERSHIP IN THE OA.



TO BECOME A MEMBER, YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED SCOUT OR EXPLORER WHO HAS EARNED THE FIRST CLASS PROGRESS AWARD AND HAS EXPERIENCED A MINIMUM OF 15 DAYS AND NIGHTS OF SCOUT CAMPING (INCLUDING A LONG-TERM CAMP). SCOUTS ARE ELECTED INTO OA BY THE VOTE OF THEIR FELLOW TROOP MEMBERS.

- The unit leader provides a list of all registered active members of his unit who he certifies meet all eligibility requirements, including attitude and participation.
- The election team leader explains the following to the unit leader:
 - This is the current method of election, and it supersedes all previous methods.
 - There is no fixed quota. All eligible boys who receive votes from at least 50 percent of those who turn in ballots are elected. In the event that no one is elected a second vote may be held immediately, and the result of this vote will be final.

- The election team determines the maximum number of names a voter may list on his ballot by reading the illustrated chart as follows:
 - Find the number eligible for election in the first column. (Note: Boys who are already members of the Order of the Arrow must not be counted as eligible.)

ELECTION CHART

Number of Boys Eligible	Maximum Names on Ballot
1 or 2	1
3 or 4	2
5 or 6	3
7 or 8	4
9 or 10	5
11 or 12	6
13 or 14	7
15 or 16	8
17 or 18	9
19 or 20	10
21 or more	Ratio of 1 to 2 (round up if number eligible is odd.)

- The maximum number of names a voter may list on his ballot is given by the number immediately to the right on the line in the second column. Example: Voters in a unit having 9 eligible may list no more than 5 names on their ballots.
 - If there are more than 20 eligible in the unit, one-half the number eligible may be listed on each ballot. If the number eligible is uneven, round the figure upward before dividing by 2.
- The team should be sure to stress the following points:
 - Select the candidates who, in your opinion, have set the best examples of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service.
 - Vote only for those you believe will continue in unselfish service to your troop.
 - If you feel that no one is worthy, turn in an unused ballot.

- If you are new in the troop and do not know the candidates well enough to vote wisely, you may abstain by not turning in a ballot at all and this will not affect the final result.
 - If you vote for fewer than the maximum number allowed, you will, in effect, be casting a vote against all others listed.
 - Boys eligible for election also vote, and they may vote for themselves if they feel they are worthy.
- When the voting is finished, the election team counts the number of ballots turned in, and enters the numbers on the unit election report.

- The team determines the minimum number of votes one must receive to be elected as follows: If the number of ballots turned in was even (2, 4, 6, 8, etc.), divide this number by two. If the number was odd (1, 3, 5, 7, etc.), add one and then divide by two. The number of votes a boy must receive to be elected is entered on the report form.
- The votes are counted in private by the election team and the unit leader to determine who has been elected. All votes count equally. If at least one has been elected, this result is final. If no one is elected, the team announces this fact and states that the unit will now be given the opportunity to vote again. Time is allowed for further explanation of the purpose of the Order, the election procedures, and for any questions. (No information about the votes received by candidates is to be revealed at any time.) The second election is then held immediately, and if the unit still elects no one, this is the final result for the year's election.

Announcement of Results. Candidates will be called out or tapped out at the earliest possible time, either at summer camp, a camporee, or a special ceremony.

Lodges can arrange to conduct a tap out ceremony at the Explorer post meeting immediately after the election.

The names and addresses (plus additional information the lodge feels is necessary) are listed on the election report form. Team members sign the form and mail it to the specified address.

Names and addresses of the newly elected candidates must be forwarded to the lodge membership committee immediately.

Candidate Status. After election, a Boy Scout, Explorer, or adult remains a candidate until he takes the Ordeal. If this period of candidacy exceeds 1 year, his name is dropped and he no longer is a candidate. To become a candidate again, he must be reelected. The executive committee of the lodge may extend the 1-year period between election and induction if a candidate is ill or there are other unusual circumstances.



PURPOSE OF THE ORDER.

To recognize those campers—Scouts, Explorers, and Scouters—who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives and by such recognition cause other campers to conduct themselves in such manner as to warrant recognition.

To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit.

To promote Scout camping, which relates its greatest effectiveness as a part of the unit's camping program, and to help strengthen the district and council camping program both year around and in the summer camp, as directed by the camping committee of the council.

To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

Membership Requirements

Unit Leader Approval. To become eligible for election, a Boy Scout or Explorer must have the approval of his unit leader prior to the election. The unit leader must certify as to his Scouting spirit, his adherence to the Scout Oath and Law, and participation in unit activities. He must also certify that the nominee meets all specified requirements at the time of this annual election.

Camping Requirements. A Boy Scout or Explorer must have 15 days and nights of camping within 2 years prior to the election under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America. These 15 days and nights must include one long-term camp (6 consecutive days) and at least 9 days and nights of short-term camping (overnight, 2, 3, or 4 days).

First Class Requirement. A Boy Scout or Explorer must hold the First Class rank to be eligible for election.

Induction. To be inducted into the Order of the Arrow, candidates must participate in the Ordeal and the Ordeal ceremony.

Adult Membership. Adult membership in the Order of the Arrow is limited to registered male Scouters.

For Unit, District, and Council Scouters. A unit holding its annual election for members may elect its unit leader, one of the assistant unit leaders (over age 18), or male committee member, provided he meets the camping requirements (15 days and nights of camping, including one long-term camp). Only unit adults may participate in this election and one male adult per year may be elected.

Election Procedures

To become a member of the Order of the Arrow a Boy Scout or Explorer is chosen by vote of the young men in his unit. This is a unique feature of the Order since the majority of those who select their candidates for this honor are not members of the lodge. However, lodge members in the unit have a vote as well as nonmembers. In this way membership is controlled by the young men in their own units and not by those who are already Arrowmen.

It is important that the members of the unit have the "requirements to become a candidate" properly explained to them. Candidates should be chosen on the basis of being true Scouts or Explorers and qualified campers.

Unit Election Procedure

1. Hold the election at the time and place determined by the unit leader with Boy Scouts or Explorers assembled with their unit leader ready to elect candidates.

2. Before the election, the OA team must secure from the unit leader verification that at least 50 percent of the registered active unit membership is present. In a coed Explorer post, 50 percent of the active male membership must be present. If 50 percent is not present, an election cannot be held. The number registered and the number present are entered in the spaces provided on the unit election report form illustrated. If the unit leader is an Arrowman, he may explain to the group the purpose of the Order of the Arrow and the basis upon which candidates should be selected, and describe the method of election. If the unit leader is not a member of the Order, a member of the OA team with the unit leader's consent should make this presentation, the object being that election leadership is a cooperative effort of the unit leader and the OA team. The Order should be represented by a two- or three-member team from the lodge or chapter unit elections committee.

Registered Active Member. In Boy Scout troops every registered active member of the troop under age 18 at the time of election is eligible to vote. In Explorer units every registered active male member of the unit under age 21 at the time of the election (except associate post Adviser) is eligible to vote.

A Boy Scout or Explorer who carries a current national membership card and participates in at least some unit activities during the year is considered to be a registered active member of the unit. For example, a young man away at college who participates in some unit activities when home, such as a camp-out, camporee, or occasional unit meeting, should be considered as a registered active member.

A boy who moves away or drops out of the unit because of other interests would not be counted in the registered active membership figure.

Dear Candidate:

Congratulations on your election to the Order of the Arrow. You are now eligible to become a member of Achewon Nimat Lodge #282 by passing an Ordeal Ceremony.

Your Ordeal must be within one year of your election as a candidate. A reservation form for your Ordeal and a health record form must be in the Scout Office at least two weeks in advance of the Ordeal you plan to attend. Try to send them in earlier. Dates and places are described on the reservation form.

Total cost of the Ordeal is \$16.00. This fee includes (prices are approximate): Ordeal Sash \$5.00, Ribbon Pin \$1.05, Handbook \$1.30, current membership dues \$4.50, and your meals \$4.00. The entire cost must be paid in advance, along with your reservation for the Ordeal. Additional Order of the Arrow items will be available for purchase (i.e., pocket patch \$2.50-3.00, jacket patch \$2.50, working neckerchief \$3.75, special one per life neckerchief \$10.00, OA Lodge T-shirt \$3.75, belt buckle \$8.50, etc.).

If you cancel your reservation after the food has been purchased, or fail to come to your Ordeal, your food fee of \$4.00 will be forfeited. All other fees may be credited upon request to a future Ordeal at which time you will have to pay an additional food fee. (You must adhere to the one-year requirement.)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Please eat dinner before arriving at the Ordeal on Friday evening.
2. Please provide your own transportation to and from the Ordeal. You should plan on arriving at camp as follows: Camp Royaneh and Los Mochos 8:30 p.m.; Wente Scout Reservation 10:00 p.m. Instructions are on the reverse side of this sheet. Pickup time on Sunday is approximately 9:30 a.m.
3. YOU WILL NEED:
 - a. Ground cloth, sleeping bag, pocket knife, eating and personal cooking utensils (knife, fork, spoon, cup, small frying pan), toilet articles, and one change of old work clothes. All items should be packed and ready for hiking.
 - b. Carry a sweater or jacket.
 - c. All candidates must have a breechcloth at the Ordeal. For instructions on how to make, see the instructions on the reverse side of this sheet. (Depending on weather conditions, you will be required to remove your pants.)
 - d. Wear your Scout or Explorer Uniform and comfortable hiking shoes. Bring your current registration card showing membership in the Boy Scouts of America.

Remember, using the Council Camps is a privilege extended to members of the Order of the Arrow. Try to leave the camp a little better than you found it.

We look forward to having you in our Lodge.

ATTENTION UNIT LEADERS

DUES ARE DUE !

The Lodge and the Village in your District is here to help you. There are four main purposes of the Order of the Arrow (stated on page 17). The first one can be fulfilled when your unit holds an election for the OA. Call the Village Chief and/or the Village Advisor in your District to make the arrangements. A team will come to your unit and hold the election. Simerily, the third purpose "Promote Scout Camping" can be accomplished when an OA team visits your unit and puts on a Camping Promotion Show. It could be just limited to a show about our Council camps or it could include such things as Philmont, other high adventure camps or a demonstration of certain camping skills (based on your needs). Contact the Village Chief or Advisor.

Note: If you have any individuals that were tapped out prior to summer camp (or at another councils camp) and he has not yet attended his ordeal, let us know so we can send him the new candidate ordeal registration and health forms.

CANDIDATE LETTER/OA PURPOSE/ELECTION

To keep our membership informed, the next three pages contain information that is used by certain groups within the LODGE. Page 16 contains a copy of the candidate letter that is presently given to each candidate right after the tap out. Attached to this letter would normally be an ordeal registration form, a health form and other special instructions (how to make a breechcloth and directions to the ordeal location). Pages 17 and 18 include the purpose of the OA and the current membership requirements and election procedures.

As we begin a new Lodge year, dues are again due and payable by October 1st. For a pittance of \$4.50, you get membership in Achewon Nimat Lodge and the OA for a full year, a subscription to the Arrowpoint, and (Brotherhood members take note) maintain your eligibility for the Vigil honor. Each additional family member paying at the same time receives a reduction in dues to \$3.00 (if you pay separately or receive separate copies of the Arrowpoint, it is still \$4.50). See the center pull-out and pay your dues today!

EVENTS REGISTRATION

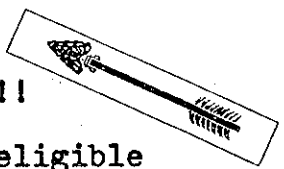

This ordeal will be run by villages under a lodge ordeal master at Camp Rancho Los Mochos on November 5th thru 7th.

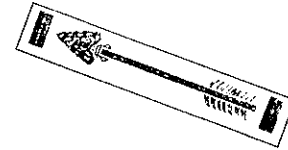
LECM -

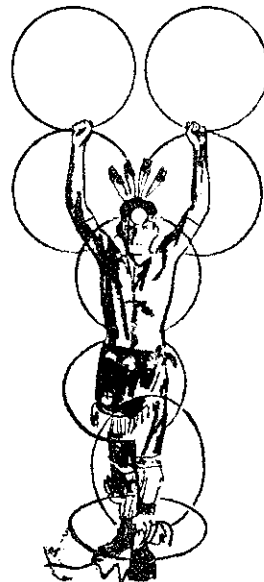
ATTENTION VILLAGE CHIEFS

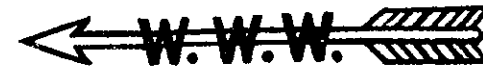

BEADS

For the benefit of our readers, here is an outline of our Lodge's wam-pum bead system, which was initially created to show the history of a members participation in the Lodge. Each Lodge or village activity is marked by a distinctive bead.

SMALL BEADS

dk blue	-lodge activity
lt blue	-section activity
brown	-chapter activity (defunct)
white	-village activity
black	-LECM
green	-LEC member for one year
yellow	-service
red	-ordeal

MULTICOLORED BEADS

red, white, & blue	-natl OA conf
red, blue, yellow	-Lodge/Section Training
blue, white, brown	-scoutorama
red, white, green	-Wintercamp staff

LARGE BEADS

one red	-Ordeal
two red	-Brotherhood
three red	-Vigil

brown	-Lodge or Section Plaque
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Beads are dispensed by the Lodge Chief or his appointed representative. A special bead is usually given out at the Mikemosin, and new beads may be added from time to time

NEW LODGE FLAP

As an incentive for Ordeal members to seal their membership in the Order of the Arrow, the Lodge Chief's Cabinet, at their June meeting, decided to create a new Brotherhood flap. The flap will have a red border and be available to all registered Brotherhood members at any lodge function where the trading post is open. Members will be able to purchase only one flap at a time. The flap should be available by the Lodge Training Conference on September 18th. The cost will be approximately \$2.50.

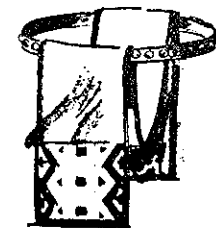

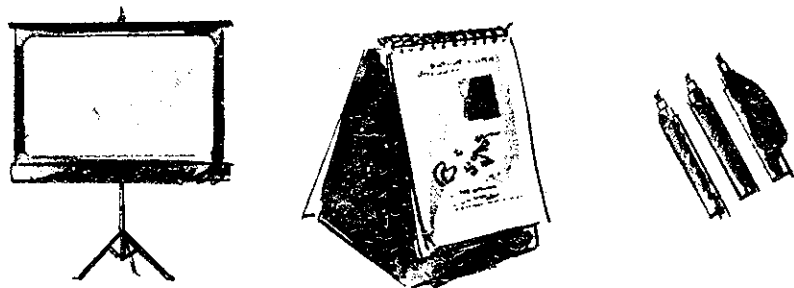

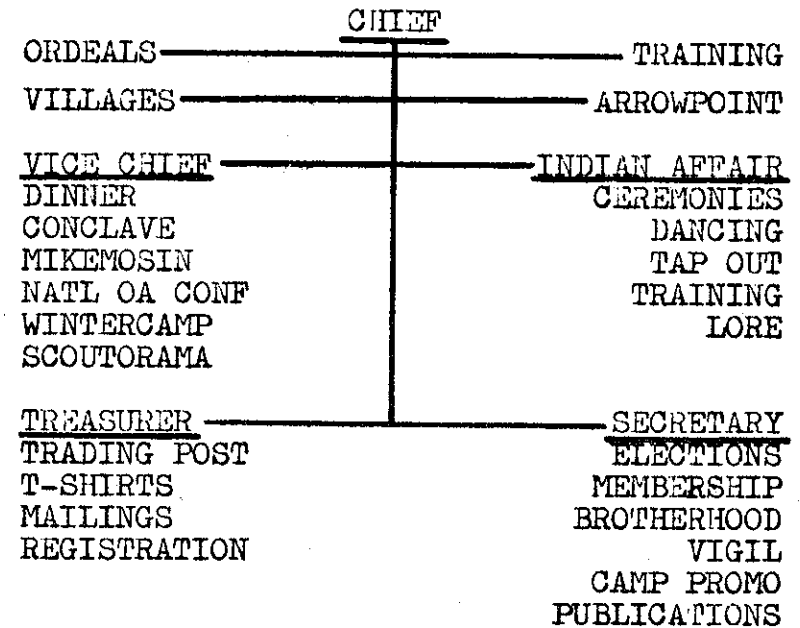


LODGE OFFICER'S TRAINING -
