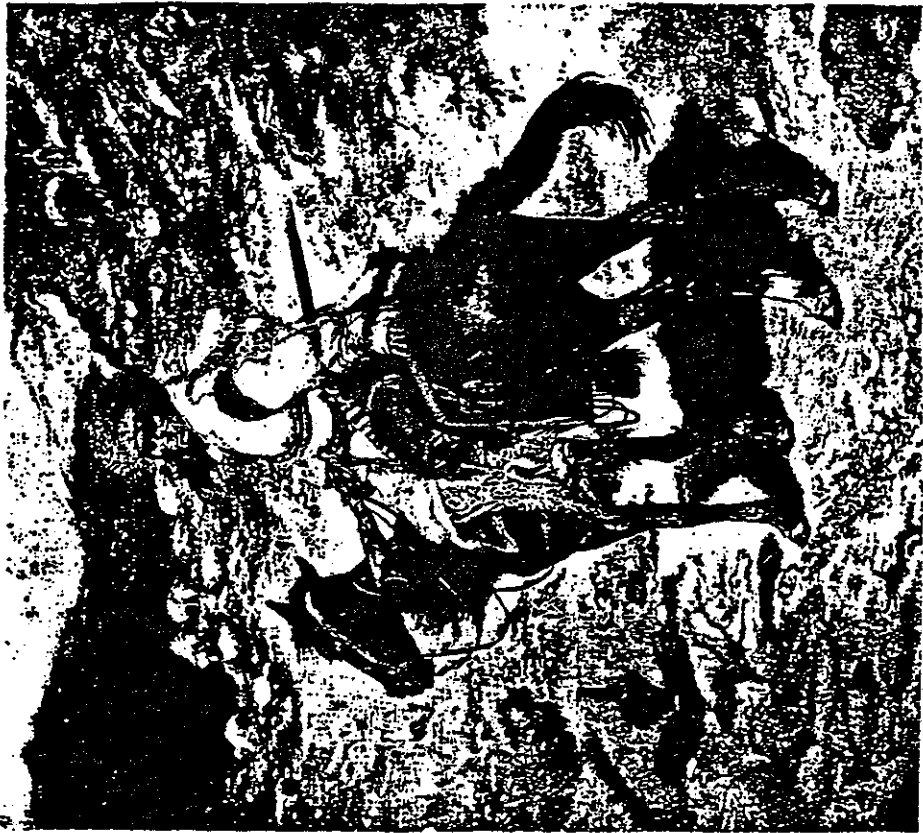

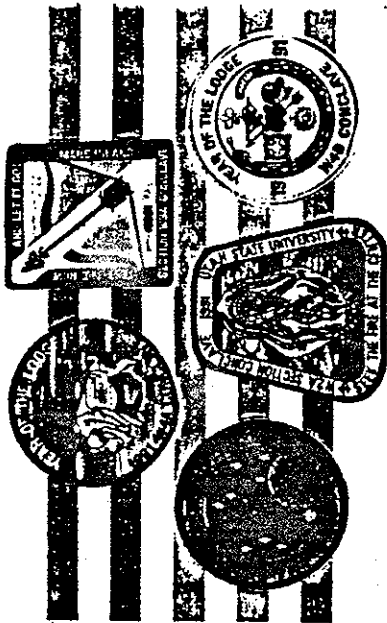

## Conclaves Offer Training and Fellowship During "Year of the Lodge"

Five conclaves were held this spring as Sections throughout the region gathered for weekends of fun and fellowship, and to carry out the annual tasks of electing officers. Each program emphasized the "Year of the Lodge" in its planning and execution.

The WAA Conclave was held March 15-17 at LaSalle High School in Pasadena, CA. Over 500 participants were present. Special guests included Region Chief Louis Monville III and Region Chairman Esten F. Grubb, as well as National Committeeman Bobby R. Rainwater, Regional Committeemen Thomas H. Tebb and Kurt E. Christensen, and their Regional Committeeman Michael Southall.

The W2A Conclave, held the weekend of April 5-7 at Mare Island Naval Shipyard near Vallejo, CA, was host to over 400 Arrowmen. The theme for the event was "Test the Bow and Let it Go!" and National Vice Chief Jeff Posey was an invited guest. Also in attendance were Region Chairman Esten F. Grubb, National Committeeman Bobby R. Rainwater, Regional Committeeman Thomas H. Tebb, and then Regional Committeeman Steve Friesen.

One week later, the W2A Conclave was

held carrying the theme "Seek the Fire at the Center". The location for the event was Utah State University in Logan. More than 300 delegates were there, including Region Chief Louis G. Monville III who was on hand to assist with training and provide information about national programs. Also in attendance was then Regional Committeeman S. Jay Fairbanks.

The W1B Conclave was held April 26-28 at Camp Brinkley in Washington. Over 240 Arrowmen participated. Special guests included Region Chief Louis G. Monville III and Region Chairman Esten F. Grubb, as well as National Committeeman Del Loder, and then Regional Committeeman Pat W. McGowan. The event featured a "Search for the Golden Arrow" Competition, and participation by six members who traveled more than 1,800 miles from Anchorage, AK to be representatives of the former Section W1D, merged into W1B last year.

Rounding out the season was the W4B Conclave held May 3-5 at March Air Force Base near Redlands, CA. Participants numbering approximately 600 attended the event whose theme was "Together We Stand." National Chief Chit Takeshita and Region Chief Louis Monville III were invited guests. Also on hand were Region Chairman Esten F. Grubb, National Committeeman Bobby R. Rainwater, Regional Committeeman

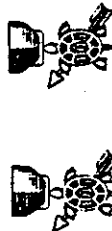

#### FIRM BOUND IN BROTHERHOOD

Have you become a Brotherhood member yet? If not, do you know the requirements?

1. Memorize the signs of Order of the Arrow Membership.  
Memorize the OA Obligation, Song, Admonition, Sign and Handclasp.
2. Advance your understanding of the Ordeal. Study the questions on the customs and traditions of the Ordeal. How have you supported Scouting and the camping program? Have you been faithful to your pledge of Brotherhood and cheerful service to others?
3. Serve your unit. During the period of at least 10 months, expand your service to your own unit.
4. Plan for Service in your Lodge. Retain your OA registration; pay your dues; develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill your Pledge.
5. Review your progress. Write a letter to the Lodge Secretary explaining: 1) What you think the Obligation means; 2) How you have been fulfilling the Obligation in your daily life and how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in this service; and 3) Your specific plans to give service to the Lodge program.

Brotherhood membership in the Order of the Arrow is not a rank or a step up the ladder in the same sense as from First Class Scout to Star, Life, and Eagle Scout.  
Brotherhood membership is the completion of the process of becoming a true Arrowman. Brotherhood members have no special privileges that are not open to Ordeal members, except to attend Brotherhood ceremonies. They do, however, have additional responsibilities and obligations.

After 10 months or more of active membership in the Order, Ordeal members may "seal" their membership and learn more about the true meaning of brotherhood by becoming Brotherhood members. Members should not take part in the Brotherhood ceremony unless they truly wish to continue actively in Scouting and the Order of the Arrow.

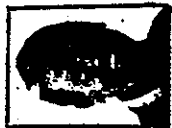

**FROM THE WESTERN REGION CHAIRMAN**



Having met with many council Scout Executives over the past year, I would like to bring to your attention some of their comments. The most frequent of these concerned uniforming. Descriptions ranged from "barely adequate" to "disgraceful." As "example-better," we should strive to be in proper uniform, not only at OA events, but at all other Scouting events as well.

A second issue frequently raised was a notable decline in the number of participants in service projects - a trend confirmed by reported service hours on Lodge charters in 1990 in the Western Region. Most councils rely heavily on the "cheerful service" of members to assist with, for example, opening and closing camps, Encouraging Arrowmen to take part in such service projects should clearly be a priority of each and every Lodge.

Lastly, was a "desire" that Lodges find a way to contribute financially to their council's well-being - a means of "giving something back" to Scouting. Nearly two-thirds of the Lodges in the region report a financial contribution of some kind. Hopefully this figure can be 100% next year.

**ORDER OF THE ARROW ELECTION PROCEDURES**

Spring is just around the corner and it will be time for Unit  
Elections. The Lodge will be conducting classes during the next  
few ordeals to train members to serve on Unit Election Teams.

The purpose of the Order of the Arrow is to recognize those  
campers (Scouts) who best exemplify the principles of Scouting,  
to develop camping traditions, to promote Scout camping (in the  
units camping program and the councils), and to crystallize the  
Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in  
cheerful service to others.

There are specific Youth and Adult membership requirements  
that are outlined in the Lodge Election Procedures Guide.

The actual election has a unique feature. To become a member  
of the Order of the Arrow a Scout is chosen by a vote of the  
youth members in their Unit. This is unique since the majority  
of those who select their candidates for this honor are not members  
of the Lodge. (However, Lodge members in the Unit have a vote  
as well as non-members) In this way membership is controlled by  
the youth members in their Units and not by those who are already  
Arrowmen.

There are specific procedures that must be followed at the  
time of the Unit election. The Team must verify that at least  
50% of the active Unit members are present at the election. The  
Unit leader must provide a list of registered active members  
that meet the eligibility requirements. The Team then determines,  
by formula, the maximum number of names a voter may list on  
their ballot from the list of eligible Scouts.

The Team must also make sure that the Youth Unit Election  
Report is filled out correctly and completely. It is most  
important to list when the Unit wishes to hold its callout (at  
camporee, summercamp or other special occasion).

Being trained is the key to successful Unit elections. Only  
members who have been trained can conduct Unit elections. Increase  
your knowledge of the Order and assist the Lodge by attending  
the training sessions, become trained and serve on a Unit election.

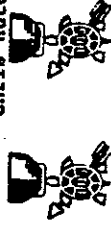
