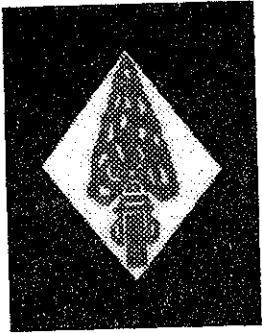


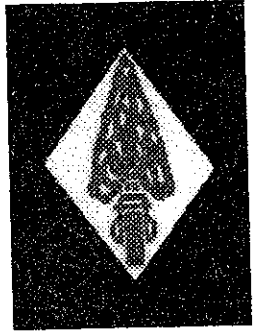

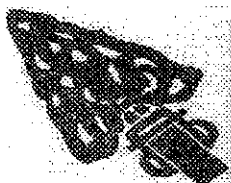

1. From the Bay Bridge

Take the Main/Embarcadero (formerly Fremont) exit from the left lane of the Bay Bridge. Follow it under the freeway to Harrison. Turn left on Harrison. Follow Harrison a few blocks and turn right on Third Street.

2. From the Golden Gate Bridge

Take the Marina exit and follow to Bay Street. Turn left and follow Bay Street all the way to Embarcadero. Turn right (at Pier 33) and follow Embarcadero (past Pier 29) to Battery. Turn right on Battery. Follow Battery to Harrison (Battery becomes First after crossing Market). Turn right on Harrison. Follow Harrison and turn right on Third Street. You'll see our building on the corner.

3. From BART

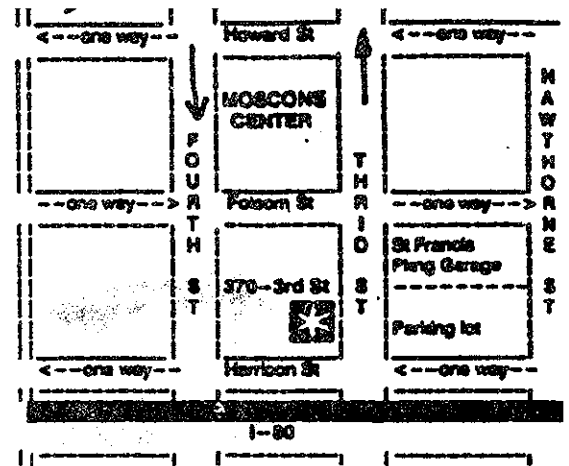
Get off at the Montgomery Street station. Exit on to Market Street. Walk west one block to Third Street. Turn left (south) and walk down Third Street, past Moscone Center. Our building is at 370 Third Street. It's about a 10-minute walk.

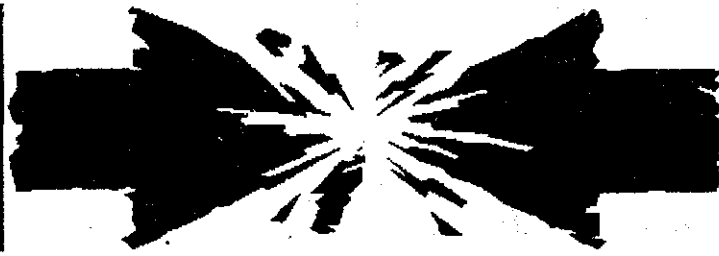
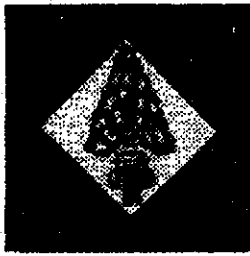
4. From San Francisco Airport/Peninsula
