WAMPUM NECKLACE



The "Wampum Necklace is designed to tell your Order of the Arrow history.... For each Village or Lodge activity you attend, you'll receive a color-coded bead which represents that activity. The more activities you attend, the more beads you'll receive for your Wampum.

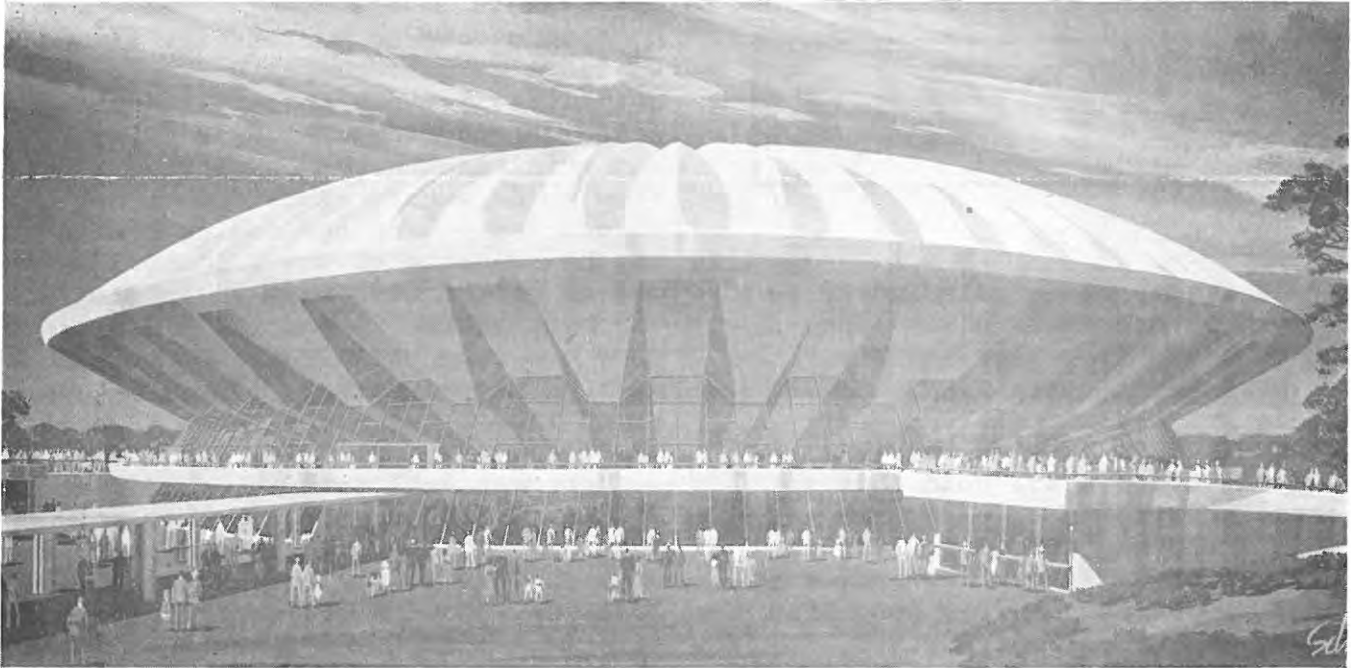
Heres how it works!!!!!!

1. All members and New members will receive a 40 inch piece of lace inwhich to begin their Wampum. If you hold the honor of Ordeal, you'll receive 1 Big Red Bead; Brotherhood - 2 Big Red Beads; Vigil - 3 Big Red Beads. This will be the 1st set of beads for you Wampum.
2. Now that you have your Honor Bead (Big Red) you can start getting your activity beads. If you attend:
 - a Village Activity - 1 White Bead
 - a Village / Lodge Workparty or Service Project - 1 Yellow Bead.
 - a Induction Ordeal - 1 small Red Bead
 - a Lodge Activity - Blue Bead
 - a Lodge Executive Committee Meeting - 1 Black Bead
3. Plus we have a GOLD BEAD for those arrow-men who receive any Village, Lodge, Area, National, Special Awards.

The Wampum Beads can only be picked up at Activities. Can we receive beads for attending past activities? Yes, but just on certain activities. Ordeals - 1968 on; Special Award Beads - 1965 on; all other Wampum beads begin May 1, 1970. Black lace to start your Wampum Necklace will only be made available at Lodge functions.

FROM THE CHIEF

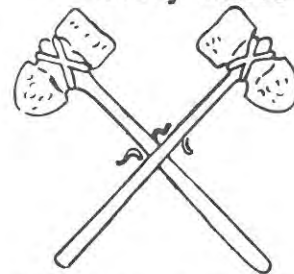

TO: All members of the Lodge Executive Committee and members of Achewon Nimat Lodge.

RE: Proposed changes to the lodge rules, to be voted on at the Mikemosin, November 7, 1970.
